### ...MANILA

POP. DENSITY (Sq km) **43,079**

The whole world's population will fit in Orissa state



### ...MUMBAI

POP. DENSITY (Sq km) **20,694**

All the people can be accommodated in Rajasthan



### ...PARIS

POP. DENSITY (Sq km) **20,980**

The entire population will fit in the state of Maharashtra



### ...DELHI

POP. DENSITY (Sq km) **7,423**

All the people will fit in Maharashtra, UP and MP



### ...ZURICH


POP. DENSITY (Sq km) **3,900**

The world's most livable city. All the people will fit in half of India



## IS THERE FOOD SHORTAGE?

## 7 BIGGEST POPULATION MILESTONES

1805

**1bn** Just a few years after Thomas Malthus predicted the demise of humans by overpopulation and famine, the 1 billionth person was born

1900

**1.65bn** The dawn of 20th century marked the beginning of a 100-year baby boom. Though, the current population explosion is happening in Asia, in 1900s, US was on top

1927

**2bn** In the interim between the two world wars, the Western world, and in particular the United States, experienced an era of prosperity and kept fueling the population boom

1959

**3bn** It took more than a century to get from 1 billion people to 2 billion people, but just 32 years to add another billion

1974

**4bn** Fifteen years and another billion—the time between billions was getting shorter. The time it took for the population to double was decreasing

1987

**5bn** When the world population hit the 5-bn mark, some demographers were still insisting that the globe could not support even that many people

1999

**6bn** Developed economies were still booming, but the population explosion baton has changed hands from Western countries to Asia
